

Crochet Ruffle Tree



Things You Need:

- Worsted weight, 4-ply yarn-green
- G crochet hook
- Foam cone 9" x 4"
- Burlap scrap
- Craft glue
- Straight pins
- Scissors
- Fabric scrap

Abbreviations:

- ch = chain
- st = stitch
- sk = skip
- sc = single crochet
- dc = double crochet
- tr= treble crochet stitch

Special Notes:

- This crochet pattern does not include a gauge as it is not a pattern that requires a sized fit.
- Adjust the spiral if the ruffle ends before you reach the top.
- Additional short ruffles can be stitched if adjusting still does not make it to the top.

What To Do:

Ruffle Trim

Ch 274

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (273 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, turn. *sc in first st, sk next st, (2 dc, 2 tr, 2 dc) in next st, sk next st.* Repeat from * to * across, ending with sc. Finish off and weave in the ends. Note: If you have miss counted or missed a skip and the last st does not end on the last st of the row, do not worry. The ends will be hidden during the wrap of the tree.



Tree Construction

Step 1: Wrap the foam cone with burlap fabric and use craft glue to attach the burlap. For extra security, use straight pins to hold the burlap in place.

Step 2: Stand the cone on your workspace. Hold the ruffle trim along the bottom edge of the cone. Using a straight pin, pin one end of the trim to the cone. Spiral the ruffle around the cone, overlapping the edges. Continue to the top. Cover the top point with the end of the ruffle and pin.

Step 3: Adjust the spirals to cover gaps. Add more straight pins to spirals as needed.

Step 4: Rip a 1 1/2" wide x 12" strip of fabric. Tie the strip into a bow and pin to the top of the tree. Note: Ribbon can be substituted for the fabric strip.
