

Baby Poop Chart With Colors, Textures, and Smells

Typical Infant Stool (Under 6 months of age)

Infant Day 1-5:

Meconium

- Dark green to black
- Sticky
- No smell

Infant Day 3-5:

Transitional Stool

- Brown
- Pasty
- No smell

Infant Day 5-6 months:

Breastfed Baby

- Yellowish
- Applesauce with mustard seeds texture
- Various unpleasant smells

Infant Day 5-6 months:

Formula Fed Baby

- Brownish / Yellow
- Applesauce with mustard seeds texture
- Various unpleasant smells

Concerning Infant Stool (Under age 6 months)

White

Can indicate poor liver or gallbladder function, blockage

Red

Can indicate poor liver or gallbladder function, blockage, or blood

Black

After transitional stool: Can indicate poor liver or gallbladder function, blockage, or blood

Watery

Can indicate infection or malabsorption

Pellets

Can indicate constipation

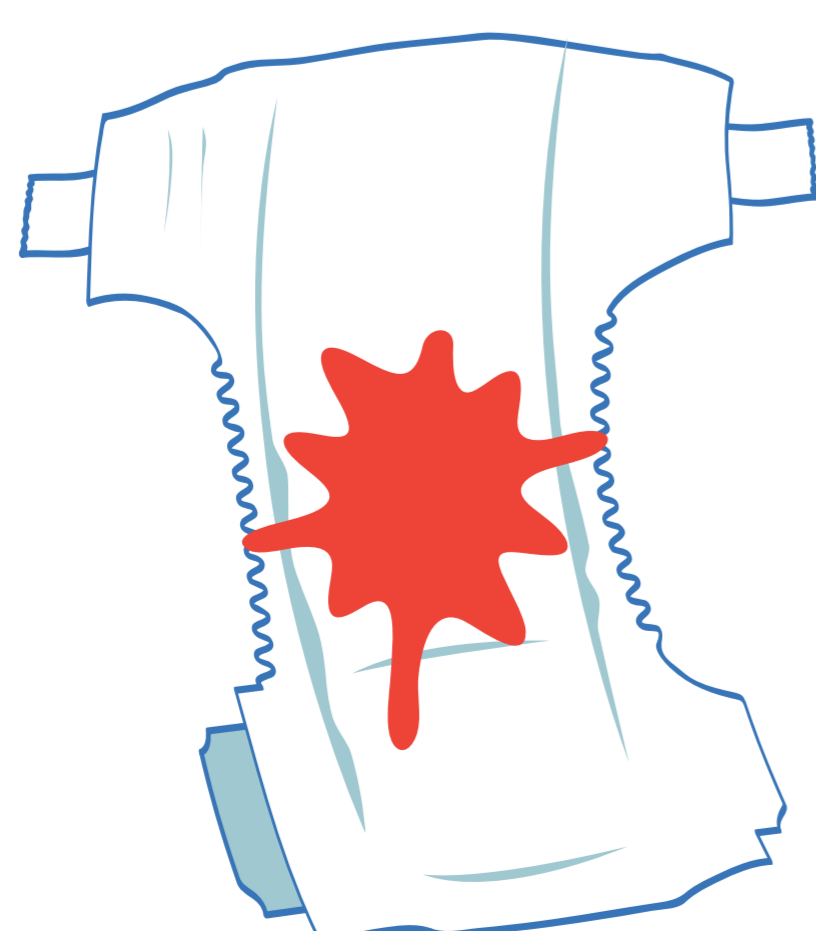
Fully Formed

Can indicate constipation

Infant Stool Requiring Emergency Attention (Under 6 months of age)

Bright red stool any time or black stool after baby has had transitional stool can indicate blood in the intestinal tract.
